Admission Test for Dental Hygiene (ATDH)

Date	Topic	Notes
Anticipated for September 1, 2023	Year-round Testing	<p>Effective September 1, 2023, the ADA's Department of Testing Services (DTS) will implement year-round testing for the ATDH Program. This change is anticipated to provide candidates and dental hygiene programs with additional flexibility. Under year-round testing, a candidate will be permitted to attempt the ATDH on any day of the year for which they can secure a testing appointment, provided they meet established ATDH eligibility criteria.</p> <p>The transition to year-round testing will also be accompanied by an improvement in the speed with which ATDH results will be reported to candidates and dental hygiene programs. Under year-round testing, results will be reported within three to four weeks of the candidate's test date. Implemented 1/21/22	Biology	Changes to the DAT Biology Test Specifications were implemented on January 21, 2022. Students who plan to take the DAT are encouraged to review the updated specifications, which include several new topics that were not previously covered on the examination. March 1, 2025	Scoring and Reporting	Starting with administrations occurring on March 1, 2025, the 2-digit score reporting scale (1 to 30) will be replaced by a 3-digit score reporting scale (200 to 600), and unofficial score reports will no longer be available at the testing site. Anticipated to be implemented in May 2026	Organic Chemistry	Updates to the DAT Organic Chemistry Test Specifications are expected to occur in May 2026. Additional information is available on the DAT webpage , and students taking the DAT in 2026 are encouraged to check back regularly for updates.
